Also qualifying were Adrianna Buccieri in the shot put (first place), Reanna Romano in the discus (2nd), and Britney Johnson in the 400 (1st).

The final score was Pinkerton 95, Souhegan 60 and Kearsage 8.

On Tuesday Pinkerton hosted Division 1 rivals Salem. The warmest day of the spring provided a great day for a meet. The Astros won the meet, 95 to 49.

Amelia Grave had double wins again, this time in the javelin (90' 4") and the 400 meters (61.53). Sophomore Hannah Peterson won both hurdle races and placed third in the triple jump. Hannah Rogers won the triple jump in a superior early season 34' 5", place 2nd in the 100 and third in the long jump.

Newcomer Heidi Helf showed she will be a top sprinter by winning the 200 meters and anchoring the 4 x 100 relay victory. Britney Johnson led an Astro sweep of the 3200 with a time of 11:26.

Other winners were Ciara April in the 1600, Adrianna Buccieri in the shot put and Reanna Romano in the discus.

Significant performances include Marryn Dennis and Megan Qualters in the pole vault, both personal best 7 feet. Julia Bartoli placed in both hurdle races in her second track meet ever.
