As the NH Meet of Champions champ at 170 lbs, Senior Captain Jack MacKiernan was the only Pinkerton wrestler at the New England Wrestling Championships held in Providence, RI. After a bye in the first round, Jack won his second round match over Pathfinder (MA) by a 19-2 score. Saturday morning, Jack faced the #1 wrestler from RI in the quarterfinals and dropped a 4-2 heartbreaker, which dropped him into the consolation bracket. He then rattled off 3 straight victories over Natick (MA), Brookline (MA) (his 100th victory) and Essex (VT) to reach the consolation finals and wrestle for 3rd place.

In the consi finals, he wrestled the Springfield Central (MA) wrestler, who was the #1 MA entry, that he had beaten in OT during the season. He finished his day by winning 8-3 and capturing 3rd place in New England.

Jack finishes his career with a 101-28 record over 3 seasons, 2 D1 State championships, an MOC championship and 3 trips to New Englands resulting in 6th and 3rd place finishes.
