<u>Career and Technical Education</u> <u>Advisory Committees</u>

Career and Technical Education (CTE) advisory committees advise, assist and provide support and advocacy for quality CTE programs. Advisory committee volunteers have the opportunity to learn more about the CTE program, and the instructors are able to increase their understanding of the job market, employers' needs and community opportunities.

CTE advisory committees:

- Provide information to update, modify, expand, and improve the quality of programs.
- Support and strengthen the partnerships between business, labor, the community, and education.
- Make recommendations that will strengthen and expand the CTE curriculum, and provide assistance in implementing these recommendations.
- Identify and validate academic and occupational competencies determining priorities, and review and evaluate programs.

Region 17 Management Committee

This committee, comprised of district representatives provides administrative oversight of the two CTE Centers (Pinkerton and Salem) in Region 17.

Program-Specific Advisory

A program-specific advisory committee focuses on providing direction for CTE programs within a high school or skills center. An objective is to provide students with valuable connections to industry and related post-secondary programs available throughout New England.



What is Expected of a CTE Advisory Committee Volunteer?

- Region 17 Management School and district administrators meet 2-3 times during the school year.
- Program specific advisory committees typically meet 2 times during the school year. For many programs the fall meeting is scheduled in the morning so the committee can meet with students and the spring meetings are in the late afternoon or evening. Each committee determines the most appropriate time for them to meet.
